Students are encouraged to use their available general electives wisely and focus on coursework that will assist them personally, academically and professionally. **If you are planning on taking ART 110 in the Fall of Junior year, you will not need to take an additional Flexible Core. ***If you are planning on taking CMLIT 334W or HIST 392W in Spring, you will not need to take an additional Writing Intensive Unit. Instead, take a 3 credit elective
