JUNIOR YEAR CHECKLIST

Below is a guide to help you navigate through Junior Year. These steps are not required, but it is highly recommended that you follow the checklist as closely as possible.	
	Meet with an academic advisor in the <u>Academic Advising Center</u> (Kiely Hall 217) each semester to ensure you have fulfilled all of your <u>general education</u> requirements.
	Meet with your major/minor advisor(s) each semester to review major/minor requirements.
	Review your Student Advisement Degree Audit regularly to ensure you are on track for graduation.
	Research requirements and timelines for graduate or professional school, if applicable.
	Prepare to take admission tests. Review for MCAT, LSAT, GMAT, or GRE, if applicable.
	Begin building relationships with professors in order to obtain letters of recommendation for graduate/professional school.
	Meet with a career counselor in the <u>Center for Career Engagement and Internships</u> (Frese Hall 213) to discuss/explore possible career paths and opportunities.
	Research three or more professions in depth.
	Attend workshops focused on job search.
	Apply for an internship. This is an excellent way to "test out" a career.
	Participate in Job Fairs. Start networking with employers.
	Prepare for interviews by attending interviewing workshops and participating in a mock interview, both which are sponsored by the <u>Center for Career Engagement and Internships</u> (Frese Hall 213).
	Consider Study Abroad opportunities. Visit the <u>Education Abroad Office</u> (King Hall 203) for more information.
	Join professional associations as a student member. Membership fees are at a deeply discounted rate for students. This is an excellent way to learn more about your field and to network with professionals working in your area of interest.
	Participate in service-learning opportunities. Graduate schools and employers like to see a good GPA plus involvement outside of the classrooms.
