The Asian/American Center

The Asian/American Center (A/AC) at Queens College of the City University of New York was founded in 1987, and is dedicated to the development of community-oriented research to analyze the experiences of Asians in the Americas and the Caribbean. Topics include education, health, community leadership and cultural expression.

The A/AC publishes working papers, information bulletins and research reports, and organizes conferences and seminars with the goal of supporting scholarship, community advocacy and dissemination of information to the general public. The Center also houses a growing research library of books, journals, and visual media. Other services offered by the A/AC are guided field visits of Queens neighborhoods for university groups and professional associations, as well as a unique Translation Program serving the Chinese, Korean and Spanish-speaking communities of New York.

The A/AC is currently building an interdisciplinary Asian American and Pacific Islander Community Studies (AAPICS) Program at Queens College with courses in various academic departments and internship opportunities in local communities.

- The Summer Institute is open to undergraduate and graduate students between the ages of 18 – 25

- Minimum GPA of 3.0 or B average (exceptions may be made in special circumstances)
- The admissions committee will select students based on these criteria as well as recommendations, seriousness of purpose, and enthusiasm to participate.
