MH and SC Employment and Certification/Licensure Data

Mental Health

Based on the MH graduates who responded to our Alumni survey conducted in the Spring of 2019, (N=20), nine out of nine who were eligible for licensure (based upon year of graduation), took and passed the National Clinical Mental Health Counselor Examination (NCMHCE) and seven responded that they were licensed.

Of the 20 MH graduates who responded 85% (N=17) were employed.

School Counseling

For SC, based on the graduates who responded to our Alumni survey (N=28), 12 were eligible for permanent certification, and eight reported having received permanent certification. For SC, of the 28 graduates who responded 70% (N=19) were employed.
