MAT Overview: Early Childhood and Childhood Education Programs

- 36 credit program
- 100 hours of mandatory course-related fieldwork
- 14 weeks of mandatory supervised student teaching for students with no prior certification
- For full-time students, classes will take place two
 evenings a week (either Monday and Wednesday or
 Tuesday and Tuesday), in the evening (4:35 pm to
 7:05 pm and then 7:15 pm to 9:45 pm)
- Classes will be facilitated via various mediums: online, hybrid, and in-person





MAT Overview: Childhood & Special Education Program

- 51 credit program
- 100 hours of mandatory course-related fieldwork
- 14 weeks of mandatory supervised student teaching in elementary school (grades 1 to 6) settings
 - Student teachers are placed at Queens College partnership sites. Students may not select their own sites for student teaching.
 - 6 week mandatory supervised internship in supporting people with significant disabilities.




Admissions Requirements

Objective: To provide prospective student-teachers with an enriching participant-observer classroom experience. Students will experience and reflect on a variety of subject-focused pedagogical practices including the following:

- classroom management
- teacher and student interactional patterns
- instructional strategies

Student Teaching in the MAT Program

The goal of student teaching is to provide student-teachers with a rich, supportive socioeducational experience, highlighted by extensive classroom teaching practice, with a primary focus on augmenting one's skills as a classroom teacher.



Student Teaching in the MAT Program

- 1. Student teachers are placed at Queens College partnership sites (i.e., NYCDOE schools, located in the borough of Queens).
- 2. Students may *not* select their own sites for student teaching.

Schedule of Student Teaching

1. Teaching schedule:

14 weeks, Monday to Thursday (full day)

2. Seminar schedule:

Every Tuesday, 4:35 pm to 7:05 (on campus)



School/Grade Placement for Student Teaching

All student-teaching placements are arranged through the Clinical Experiences and Field Placement Office.

Early Childhood Education (B-2)

- seven weeks in a pre-K or kindergarten (3 to 5 year olds) classroom
- seven weeks in a primary grade (grades 1 or 2) classroom

Childhood Education (1-6)

- seven weeks in a lower grade (1st to 3rd) classroom
- seven weeks in an upper grade (4th to 6th) classroom.



Placement for Internship in Significant Disabilities (Childhood and Special Education only)

All student-teaching placements are arranged through the Special Education Program

- Six weeks during the summer session
- 5 full days per week (Monday Thursday)
- Weekly Hybrid Seminar
- Students will be taking another course, ECPSE 720: Trends and Issues in Severe Disabilities with the internship
