APPLICATION FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

Each Fall, Queens College offers merit-based scholarships to full-time transfer students, with awards of \$2,000 per year for two years. The awards cover a significant part of the tuition for New York State residents, which is currently \$4,000 per year.

Applicants who will complete the A.A. or A.S. degree with a GPA of 3.5 and a strong academic program are encouraged to apply. The selection process is competitive and scholarships are awarded on the basis of the academic record in college, an essay, and teacher recommendations.

This application must be completed by all transfer students who wish to be considered for a Queens College Scholarship. In addition, students must complete the CUNY Transfer Application, listing Queens College as their first choice.
