## Undergraduate Degrees

**BACHELOR OF ARTS (BA) IN MUSIC**  
The BA in music is a part of a traditional liberal arts curriculum. Students complete the basic curriculum of the liberal arts at Queens College's campus and other requirements and take elective courses. This degree is well suited for students seeking a solid, structured musical education that also offers a firm foundation for graduate school and career advancement in the field. Graduates might be looking for, for example, careers as composers, conductors, arrangers, performers, college professors, theorists, musicologists, music librarians, or critics. This field also combines with music business, but the BA also would offer excellent preparation for work in the popular music field, the music business, and management or music publishing. It is a versatile degree that opens doors many ways.

**BACHELOR OF ARTS (BA) WITH MUSIC EDUCATION**  
The Bachelor of Arts with Music Education is a four-year course of study that prepares students for New York State's Initial Teacher Certification in Music, Pre-K-12. The program provides a solid, structured musical education and a firm foundation in music pedagogy for students preparing to teach in public or private schools. Students complete the college liberal arts studies and take music coursework, along with education and music education classes.

**BACHELOR OF MUSIC (BM) WITH MUSIC EDUCATION**  
This is a faster course of study for students who have been accepted into the BM program but also wish to pursue regular certification. For the first two years students follow the standard BA program including the required liberal arts requirements. Beginning in the junior year they add the additional music required and education courses required for certification. Typically, this sequence requires at least one additional year of study in order to meet all certification, including student teaching.

**BACHELOR OF MUSIC (BM) WITH PROFESSIONAL PERFORMANCE**  
The BM degree is involved open instruction in a professional performance program. It is for classical performance only, and is designed to meet the highest standards in a contemporary course of study. The degree seeks proven instruction in an instrument, mandatory requirements, a master recital, and basic curriculum of the Aaron Copland School and a qualified audition experience. Admission to this program requires pre-qualified recommendations and an organ.
