

Queens College, CUNY (NY) - Full-Time, Tenure-Track Appointment in Korean Humanities

The Department of Classical, Middle Eastern and Asian Languages and Cultures at Queens College, City University of New York (CUNY) invites applications for a tenure-track **Assistant Professor** position in **Korean humanities**, to begin in the fall semester of 2019. The fields of expertise for this position are open and include (but not limited to) history, art, religion, film, and/or cultural studies. The new faculty member will complement our existing strengths in modern Korean literature and Korean linguistics.

Responsibilities include teaching Korean humanities and language courses at all levels and contributing to the Korean and East Asian Studies programs in our department as well as to the College's liberal arts curriculum. The successful candidate will also be expected to share administrative responsibilities.

Our department offers a wide variety of courses. In addition to language courses in Ancient Greek, Latin, Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Arabic and Hebrew, we offer courses on both ancient Western and non-Western classical texts and on modern Asian and Middle Eastern cultures, taught in English and in the foreign languages we cover. By supporting linguistic and cultural knowledge and proficiency, we provide the foundation for a liberal arts education. We encourage students who have a background in the languages we teach to enhance their proficiency by taking advanced courses. Sequences of our courses may fulfill requirements for majors, minors, and interdisciplinary concentrations.

A flagship college of the CUNY system, Queens College is an urban school that offers a rigorous education in the liberal arts and sciences to a large and diverse student body. Our liberal arts, sciences, and pre-professional programs earn us high rankings in prestigious college guides.

QUALIFICATIONS:

A Ph.D. in a relevant discipline is required. ABDs may apply but must complete their Ph.D. degree by the time of appointment. Also required is native or near-native competency in Korean and English. Applicants should have a demonstrated commitment to teaching college-level Korean humanities and language courses and must provide evidence of an active research program.
