

MINUTES OF THE ACADEMIC SENATE OF QUEENS COLLEGE - MAY 11, 1972  
Academic II - Room 170

1. The Chairman, Eugene Fontinell, called the meeting to order at 3:40 p.m.

2. Approval of Agenda -

a) MOTION: Duly made (Reichardt), seconded and passed:

"To make first item on agenda resolution regarding the escalation of war in Vietnam."

(Harvey) called for quorum call. There was a quorum.

b) MOTION: Duly made (Hershenov), seconded and passed:

"To make item four - report from Department of Mathematics on course changes in mathematics."

c) MOTION: Duly made (Warren), seconded and passed:

"To make item "a" under Committee Reports - Committee on Committees."

d) MOTION: Duly made (Bass), seconded and passed:

"To make item five - resolution concerning the ad hoc Governance Committee."

e) MOTION: Duly made (Rosengarten), seconded and passed:

"To make item "d" under Committee Reports - Campus Life Committee."

f) MOTION: Duly made (Landis), seconded and passed:

"To make item "e" under Committee Reports - Undergraduate Scholastic Standards Committee."

g) MOTION: Duly made, seconded and passed:

"To approve agenda, as amended."

3. MOTION: Duly made (Reichardt), and seconded:

"Be it resolved - that the Academic Senate support the national march on Washington, May 21, 1972;

Be it further resolved - that the Queens College Moratorium Day Committee be instructed to consider ways and means to provide for Queens College students, faculty, and staff participation in that march."

MOTION: Duly made (Gilbert), seconded and passed:

"To close off debate on main motion, as amended."

Reichardt motion passed.

b) (Syrett) - Reported that the Parking Committee made three separate recommendations.

MOTION: Duly made (Garnes), and seconded:

"That the Academic Senate recommend to the President that he reject any proposal for a private parking facility on campus."

(Mandel) point of order - Motion is necessary to suspend rules to introduce Garnes' motion.

MOTION: Duly made, seconded and passed:

"To suspend rules for motion by Garnes."

(Mandel) Amendment by addition: "Further, that prior to implementing any parking proposal, the President bring such proposal before the Senate for its approval."
