

MINUTES OF THE ACADEMIC SENATE OF QUEENS COLLEGE - March 1, 1973  
Academic II - room 170

1. The Holder of the Chair, Stephen Schwerner, called the meeting to order at 3:40 p.m.

2. Announcement (Executive Committee) -

The Executive Committee voted to refer the College calendar to the Undergraduate Scholastic Standards Committee, and to report to the Senate by May, 1973.

3. a) MOTION: Duly made (Towers), and seconded:

"To reconsider Hecht's amendment to PIRG resolution (passed at Senate meeting of February 15, 1973), as follows:

But the collection of funds shall not involve the administration of the College or the University."

MOTION: Duly made, seconded and passed:

"To close off debate."

Tower's motion "to reconsider" - passed.

b) MOTION: Duly made (Bass), and seconded:

"To limit debate to thirty minutes (4:30 to 5:00 p.m.) on entire issue."

Chair - motion to limit debate is not debatable.

c) Amendment (Fleshler) - "Speakers to be limited to two minutes."

Bass/Fleshler motion - passed.

d) MOTION: Duly made (D. Agronin), seconded and failed:

"To close off debate on Hecht's amendment."

e) MOTION: Duly made (L. Schwartz), seconded and passed:

"To extend the debate time until 6:00 p.m."

f) Substitute amendment (Hevesi), as follows:

"The Senate's support for New York Public Interest Research Group is contingent on the administration of a system of fee collection in which each student receives a card with his/her registration materials that requests the student to check a box indicating that he/she desires a refund of the PIRG fee. The collection agency shall then mail such refund to each student requesting the refund. Administrative costs for this collection system shall be paid by PIRG."

## 3. PIRG Resolution (continued)

Hecht accepted Hevesi's substitute amendment.

MOTION: Duly made, seconded and passed:

"To close off debate on Hevesi's amendment."

Hevesi's amendment - passed.

g) MOTION: Duly made (Miksic), seconded and passed:

"To close off debate on Orzick's motion." (Senate meeting 2-15-73)

Orzick's motion, as amended - passed.

4. Commission Report - continuing with Article III, Section III-D  
(Senate meeting January 4, 1973.)

a) MOTION: Duly made (Miksic), and seconded:

"To change previous amendment for second sentence, as follows:

"The Division shall negotiate with the various departments for the use of a reasonable number of line faculty who have indicated a desire to participate in the program of the Division;"

Request for a quorum call. There was a quorum.

Notice of Intent (Fields) - "To reconsider, at a future date, the resolution added to Article I."

b) MOTION: Duly made (Towers), seconded and passed:

"To close off debate on all previous questions to paragraph D."

c) MOTION: Duly made, seconded and passed:

"To accept Miksic's substitute amendment for Pierce's motion."  
(January 4, 1973)

Miksic's substitute amendment - passed.

d) MOTION: Duly made, seconded and passed:

"To accept Section III-D, as amended."

e) MOTION: Duly made (Goodman), and seconded:

"To add paragraph E to Section III, as follows:

"In no case shall an interdisciplinary major's transcript  
carry a designation other than the term "interdisciplinary."  
It shall not contain any departmental designation."

Chair ruled motion out of order. Chair is upheld.

Request for quorum call. There was no quorum.

Meeting adjourned at 5:50 p.m. Next regular meeting on Thursday, March 8, 1973.
