Mandelbaum/Finkelstein amendment - passed.

- e) Editorial changes (Mandelbaum), for Article I, as follows:
  - 1. paragraph b change '8 courses' to "21 credits."
  - 2. paragraph c third line change '8 courses' to "21 credits."
  - 3. paragraph d change the words, 'For the purposes of this ruling' to "With respect to P/NC options."
  - 4. paragraph d second line change word, 'would' to "shall."
  - 5. paragraph e first line, change '8 courses' to "21 credits."
  - 6. paragraph e third line, change 'would insist' to "shall require."
- f) Amendment (Mandelbaum) Article I, paragraph c, to delete the following words:

"taken under the freshmen extended P option and all courses"

Sentence to read as follows:

"Courses that must be taken on a P basis (no letter grades given - such as Student Life Workshop) would not count as one of the 21 credits under the P/NC option."

Amendment - passed.

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g) Substitute amendment (Mandelbaum) - To add to the end of Article I, paragraph e, the following:

"If a student is found to have made excess ive use of the P/NC option, or to have used the option in courses in which he was not eligible to use it, he will be informed and given the following options:

- a) To receive a withdrawal (WP) for the excessive course or the course for which he was ineligible for a P.
- b) To have the grade P changed to the lowest letter grade which is equivalent to a P.
- c) To appeal to the committee for the right to petition the instructor for a retroactive change to a letter grade. This right the committee may grant where it is convinced that extenuating circumstances exist for the infraction. The instructor, if he is still accessible, or the chairman of the department offering the course, if the instructor is no longer accessible will, in that case, have the option of retroactively assigning a letter grade or not doing so, in which latter case the student retains options a) and b)."
