3. Special Motions (item 4-a)
  - a) MOTION: Duly made (Breier), and seconded: To accept the following resolution:
 

"Whereas, the Jewish Holiday of Passover falls this year on Wednesday, April 2, and Thursday, April 3, and

Whereas, examinations are scheduled to be administered on these days, and

Whereas, due to the observance of this Holiday, students of the Jewish faith will be unable to take these exams;

Be it resolved, that the Senate recommends no examinations be administered on Wednesday, April 2, and Thursday, April 3;

Be it further resolved, that the Senate recommends the appropriate office of the College to inform them (the Academic Departments) of this resolution."
  - b) Amendment (Waxman) - "To change 'Be it resolved' to read as follows:
 

"Be it resolved, that the Senate recommends no examinations be administered on Tuesday evening April 1, Wednesday, April 2, and Thursday, April 3."

Accepted as friendly amendment.
  - c) Seeing no further debate, Breier's resolution, as amended - passed.

"To amend agenda to consider resolution on coalition against hunger."

Whereas, one billion people suffer serious hunger at least part of the year, with ten thousand people dying every day from starvation or resultant diseases;

Be it resolved, that the Academic Senate endorses and will participate to the fullest extent possible in the Queens College program for combating world hunger sponsored by the campus Coalition Against Hunger."
