# MINUTES OF THE ACADEMIC SENATE OF QUEENS COLLEGE - October 5, 1978 Academic II - room 170

      - "IV. Composition of Dean Search Committees:
        - a) Membership may not include more than one faculty and one student member from any one department.
        - b) Student members must have completed 45 credits of college work, at least 15 credits of which have been completed at Queens College."

"All students not exempted from English 1 by examination must take either English 01 or English 1 in their freshman year and must take English 6 unless exempted no later than the end of their sophomore year.

Justification: The purpose of this is to improve students' writing skills early in their college career. This is important from the point of view of retention standards which are to be applied after sixty credits. It is also important to enable students to gain the greatest benefit from their courses."

Amendment (Manas)- "To add the words, "sophomore year" and delete the words, 'freshman year' in the first paragraph."

(Habib) request for quorum call. There was a quorum present.

Seeing no further debate, Chair called for immediate vote on Manas' amendment.

Manas' amendment - failed.

Motion for change in College English requirement - passed.

"To adopt new courses in Department of Communication Arts and Sciences."

d) MOTION: Duly made, and seconded:

"To adopt new course in Department of Chemistry, 78. Physical Biochemistry."
