4. I. Dr. Larry Mansfield gave the following report to the Senate, for the Executive Committee, regarding a challenge to the May 1979 Academic Senate student elections:

"With regard to a challenge to the May 1979 Academic Senate elections by David Miller, Nunzio DelGreco, Gregory DiMattino, and Edith Gonsalves, all of the New Party:

- a) The Committee heard from Ann Verdi regarding the administration of the Elections.
- b) MOTION: Duly made (Teitelbaum), and seconded:

"That the Executive Committee constitute itself as the Bylaw designated Committee to investigate the Miller et al. challenge."

c) MOTION: Duly made (Fontinell), seconded and passed - with one abstention (Holden):

"To table the Teitelbaum motion until after interviewing David Miller, and Nunzio DelGreco."

- d) The response of Dave Fields, Chairman of the Elections Committee, together with additional material regarding the challenge was discussed.
- e) The Committee then discussed the challenges in an interview with David Miller and Nunzio DelGreco.

- 4. I. Challenge to the May 1979 student Academic Senate elections (continued)
  - "f) Acting on the basis of the Teitelbaum motion (b above), the Executive Committee voted affirmatively with two abstentions (Holden and Mittman), to recommend to the Academic Senate that it reject the Miller et al. challenge on the following grounds:
    - i. The supporting data provided to substantiate the charges was inadequate.
    - ii. Supplementary supporting data claimed to be available by Miller during the interview was not provided despite a direct request by the Committee for the additional material."
  - II. The Chair asked if there was any debate or objections to the Elections Committee Report. Seeing no objections, the Report was adopted - unanimously. (Day student senators under challenge were not permitted to vote.)
