e) MOTION: Duly made (Mandelbaum), seconded and failed:

"To close off debate on the resolution."

- g) MOTION: Duly made (R. Paretzky), seconded and failed:

"To call all previous questions."

h) MOTION: Duly made (Hechler), seconded and passed:

"To close off debate on Berger's amendment."

Berger's amendment - passed.

i) Substitute Motion: Duly made (Mansfield), and seconded:

"Students may withdraw from a course without penalty during the first eight weeks of the semester."

Editorial change (Backner) - "To add the words, "or evaluation" after the word, 'penalty'."
