6. II. C. c) ACE E4. Justification

Justification: ACE students often have responsibilities that make the pursuit of a college degree by a normal schedule difficult. At the same time, they are assumed to be more mature than the usual college student, so that they should be better prepared for self-directed study. For these reasons, the ACE program has designed a few courses to accommodate the special needs and capabilities of these students. ACE E4, Studies in Visual Arts and Music, is one of these courses, which can also be used to satisfy the LASAR requirement for Humanities II for ACE students only.

The course will consider a number of topics while examining masterpieces of music and art. At every stage similar concerns and departures in both arts will be considered. The divergences between the arts, resulting from different sensory systems, different means employed, and the different personalities of the major individual artist will also be noted.

Among the topics in which the two arts will be treated together are: The elements of a work in both arts and possible parallels between them (time-space; timbre-color; harmony-perspective; the low-high pitch continuum-the dark light continuum); depiction vs. abstraction in both arts; how form enhances expression in both arts (and how this influences the process of the onlooker-listener); parallels and divergences between the arts in specific historic style periods (for example, Gothic, Renaissance, Baroque, neo-Classical, Romantic, Impressionist); and the modernist revolt in both arts.

Lectures, discussion, independent study under faculty supervision, visits to museums (at least 3), attendance at concerts (at least 3) four writing assignments and final examination.

Projected enrollment: 30 students; to be offered every semester."
