The Chair read Mr. O'Hara's letter of November 28 1989, stating that after consulting with Mr. Alan Margolis, it was agreed that Dr. Jacobowitz could continue his duties as Executive Officer through June 30, 1990.

d) Mr. David Pecoraro read the following In Memoriam statement:

"Yesterday, December 6, 1989, 13 female students were gunned down in cold blood at the University of Montreal, School of Engineering. They were murdered for being women.

I would like the Senate to rise for a moment of silence for these slain students, so that we may all reflect on the hatred that led to this brutality."

Mr. Pecoraro requested that the Senate Secretary send a letter of condolence to the Dean of the School of Engineering at the University.

The Senate paid its respects by rising for a moment of silence.

Whereas, current policy requires an INC grade unaccompanied by a contract to be posted as PEN by the Registrar, and

Whereas, current policy requires the grade of PEN to be converted to F if a contract is not received by the Registrar by the end of the students next semester in residence, even when the student has satisfactorily completed the work in a timely way, therefore

Be it resolved, that the grade of PEN as used by the College revert to the usage defined by the University, and INC be used to indicate an incomplete grade with or without a contract.

Be it further resolved, that paragraph C-4. and sub-paragaraph C-4-a) under the section 'The Curriculum' of the <u>Academic Senate</u> Policies 1970-1988 (page 15), be changed to read as follows:

- 4. When an instructor enters the grade of INC on the grade roster, and submits the grade roster to the Registrar, the Registrar shall enter the grade of INC on the student's record card.
- 4-a) The Undergaduate Scholastic Standards Committee may authorize either "An Extension of Time" or "Permission to Complete" beyond the next semester in residence ONLY for those courses in which an INC grade was received AND for which a contact, defining the scope of the work to be completed and the date by which it is to be completed, has been submitted to the Department no later than the end of the eighth week of the students next semester in residence, unless the student can demonstrate to the Committee that it is not possible to arrange for an incomplete contract with the instructor.
- 4-b) For the purpose of this policy, the next semester in residence is one in which the student is registered and attends classes. A semester in which a student has been given an Official Leave of Absence, or withdrawn from ALL courses shall NOT be considered the next semester in residence."

6. F. I. Resolution to Modify INC-PEN Policy (continued)

The grade of S (satisfactory) may, at the option of a department or program and with the permission of the Senate, be awarded in those courses in which there is no guaranteed degree of success associated with a given effort or for which there is no uniform basis for evaluating an outcome on a graded scale, or for which a ranking is not appropriate. Grades A through D may not be assigned by the instructor for these courses, although the grades of INC, or ABS will be converted to F as per present policy.

The grade of PEN (no grade submitted) may be converted to W by the Undergraduate Scholastic Standards Committee upon written recommendation from the department or program in a course where the S/F grade is used. The P/NC option is not available for these courses but the F grade will be automatically converted to NC for first semester freshman."

MOTION: Duly made (McGrath), seconded and passed:

"To close off debate on the resolution."

Motion to adopt the resolution to Introduce S/F Grades - failed.
