Included are case history examples of human impact on the physical environment, such as toxic waste disposal, sludge management, pollution of the potable groundwater supply, sewage effluent, contamination of estuaries and anthropogenic cause of redtides, among others. Proposals are offered on land-use planning and on strategies for energy consumption, agriculture and manufacturing.
