The evening saw the first recipients of our Leadership *Essentials Certificate*. Nine students completed all BALA courses, plus the new 300-level course, *Leading Across Cultures*. This course, taught by **Arda Nazerian**, promoted the importance of leadership and the role leaders play in fostering a positive work environment. In addition to these courses, they also attended two of three very distinct leadership workshops throughout the semester. Our first workshop was a Business Breakfast, an event presented monthly by the Queens College School of Business. Speaking at this

event was **Kenneth Correa**, Managing Director at Merrill Lynch Wealth Management and National Business Development Executive. After his speech, Mr. Correa kindly remained to speak specifically with our BALA students. He was very well received, and our students gained valuable knowledge from him.

Our second event was a Book Signing and Meet & Greet with **Frank Boccio**. Mr. Boccio is a QC alumnus, who served as Vice Chairman of the New York Life Foundation and has kindly donated some of his books to the School of Business.
