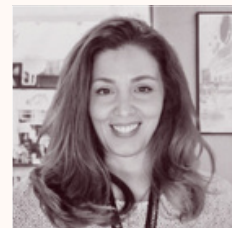

Taking the helm as Interim Director of BALA is **Tao Wang**, who has held this position since July 2025. 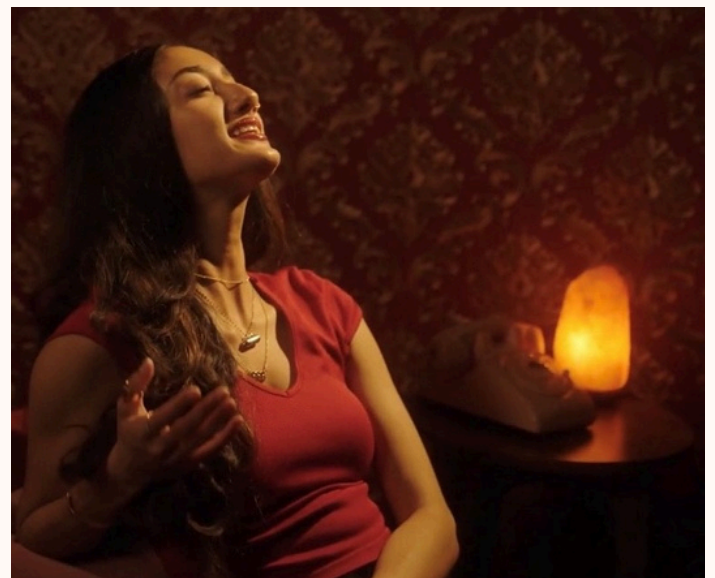
STUDENT NEWS
