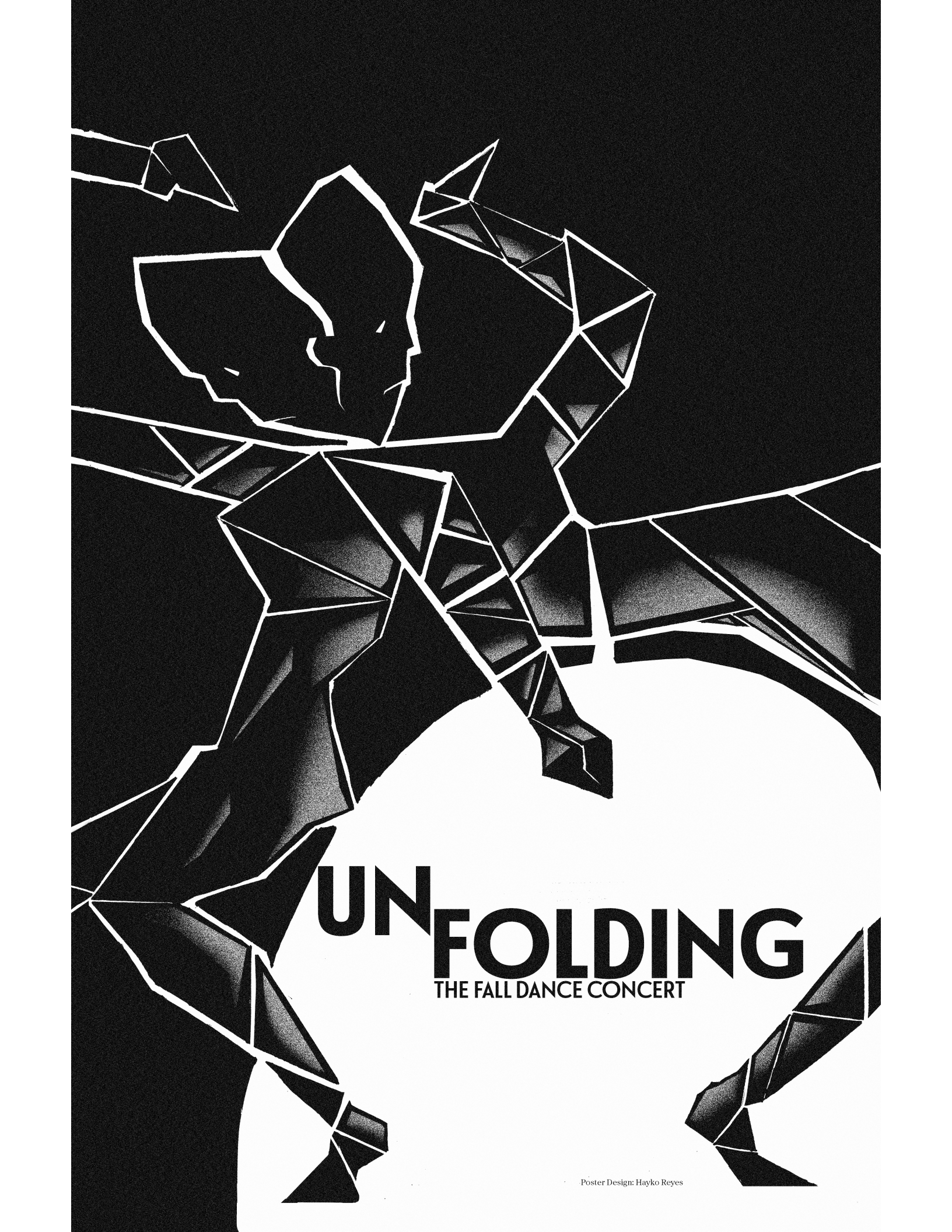

New York City recycles only 20 percent of its waste and sends more than 14 million tons of trash to landfills every year, which is nearly 10 percent of the nation's total waste. According to the Environmental Protection Agency, municipal solid waste landfills were responsible for 15 percent of total methane emissions in 2020. Methane is a potent greenhouse gas that is contributing to increasing temperatures and climate change. New York City sends its trash to upstate New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and even South Carolina and Ohio for processing. Landfills and waste processing sites are frequently located in under-resourced communities resulting in high rates of harmful pollutants that cause respiratory illnesses like asthma, and cardiovascular diseases like damage to blood vessels, blood clots and birth defects.
