In preparation for travel, international students should bring the following documents with them:

F-1 Enrolled Student:

• **Unexpired Form I-20**, "Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant Student Status" with <u>valid</u> travel endorsement signature. The signature on page 2 must be less than 12 months old on the date you return.

How to get your travel endorsement signature:

- o To request a Travel Endorsement on your I-20, Please use our <u>Virtual Office Assistant</u> and click the <u>Travel Endorsement Signature</u> button.
- ISS will issue a new I-20 or DS-2019 for travel. The I-20 will be emailed to your QC email, the DS-2019 will be available for pick up in the ISS office or can be mailed to you.
- o ISS processing is currently 7-10 business days so please plan accordingly.
- Be sure to also check your program end date on page 1 and ensure it will remain valid beyond your re- entry.
- Unexpired passport valid until at least 6 months into the future
- Unexpired F-1 visa (Canadians are exempt from visa requirement)

Apply for passport or visa renewal in the student's home country, if necessary.

A nonimmigrant student who has either an expired passport or one that will expire within six months should apply for renewals while at home. A student who holds an expired visa must apply for renewal prior to re-entering the U.S. Students should check the website of the U.S. Embassy or Consulate in their home country to make an appointment once they know their travel dates. A student traveling on expired or soon-to-expire documents may have trouble when seeking re-entry into the United States.

A student traveling to a third country must check the visa requirements for that country before

- Recommended: <u>SEVIS Fee Receipt</u>. Look under "Check I-901 Status"
- Recommended: Proof of enrollment which can be a transcript or printout showing current enrollment.
- Recommended: Proof of funding (copy of letter offering you an assistantship, financial documentation provided for the issuance of your I-20, etc.)

Students who are traveling during OPT need the additional documents

- Unexpired I-20 with valid travel endorsement signature. The signature on page 2 must be less than 6 months old on the date you return.
- Valid Employment Authorization Document (EAD card)
- Job offer letter or letter confirming current employment be sure that this employment is reflected in the SEVP Portal. If you have not reported this employment, please review the OPT instruction on our website "Maintaining status on Post-OPT" or "Maintaining Status on STEM OPT to learn more"
