## **Course Offerings**

Students can enroll in any course while at Queens College as long as they have met the prerequirements (if any).

Exchange applicants are encouraged to explore the different departments before arrival on the Queens College Website.

When they are finally accepted into the university, they will have access to CUNYfirst and search for classes offered the following semester. There is no guarantee you will be able to enroll in all of your desired courses.

# Students can only take 4 classes (12 credits)

- In general, Exchange Students are not allowed to take English "W" courses, as they are very intensive. Exceptions may be made for English majors. This rule does not apply to native speakers.
- Education & Computer Science classes are not guaranteed.
- BALA (Business) may have restrictions on the number of BALA courses one student can take
- Students—with the exception of music students—are also not allowed to take Graduate Courses (700-level Courses).
- If a graduate student would like to study at Queens College, he/she must enroll in undergraduate classes.
- Music students must audition.

**March/April -** Fall courses are posted on CUNYFirst.

**Early November-** Spring courses are posted on CUNYFirst.

	Students should register for courses <u>immediately</u> after we email them their registration information. Courses fill up quickly.
Deadlines for Registration	When exchange student finally select classes, the deadline to add/drop courses is as follows:  • Fall/Academic Year: End of August/1st week of September  • Spring: End of January/1st week of February
Enrollment	Around four to six weeks after receiving all the application materials, Queens College will send the visa paperwork and admission information to the home university of the students. Admission information includes the CUNYfirst Student ID and how to enroll for classes.
	All courses are taught in English, unless they choose to enroll in Foreign Language courses during the semester.

VISA INFORMATION	
Visa Requirements	Students must apply for a J-1 Visa to study at Queens College. When the students have sent all the required materials a part of the application, they will be sent the visa paper work they must take to the American consulate/embassy in order to obtain the Visa. This will be 2-4 weeks after the reception of their acceptance email.
Health Coverage	You must purchase health insurance for your entire stay in the United States before you travel to the United States.
	You can use an insurance company from your own country or an international company.

Working in the U.S.	The process of receiving clearance from the U.S. government to work on campus can be lengthy, and most opportunities are for yearlong students.  You can work on campus, but you must complete the following:  1. Obtain a letter on letterhead from the department wanting to hire you.  2. Email the letter and your DS-2019 form (Visa Letter) to Patrick O'Connell:  Patrick.Oconnell@qc.cuny.edu.  3. Go to the nearest Social Security office



4. You will receive a social security card in
two-four weeks.

Housing	Students should apply for housing as soon as they submit their exchange applications!  On-campus housing is first-come, first-served, and not guaranteed.  Priority is given to Academic Year students. Spring students also have a higher chance of securing a dorm room.
	That being said, our students are usually able to obtain a room; but this also depends on the number of residents in the dorm, so <b>students should be open to off-campus housing, as well.</b> Once a student receives a contract from the Summit, this means that he/she is guaranteed a room.
	<ul> <li>Be sure to let the Summit know that you are only staying at Queens College for Fall 2025 <u>BEFORE</u> signing the contract</li> <li>Yearlong students who apply to the dorm must stay there both semesters.</li> </ul>



- If you no longer want the room, DO NOT sign the contract.
- Students who sign a contract with the Summit and then cancel are subject to a cancellation fee (at least \$1,000).

Students who sign up for two semesters at the dorm will not be allowed to change housing from on campus to off campus after the end of the first semester.

### On Campus Housing (The Summit Dorms) Academic Year 2024 – 2025 Prices:

- **Shared Double Room:** \$6,400 per semester Single Occupancy Room: \$8,250 per semester
  - o AY 2025-26 prices are not yet available
  - o Dorm prices change every year and are likely to increase in the future.

Students should complete an application to the Summit as soon as their exchange application is submitted.
