HOUSING

You have two options: Housing on campus or off campus.

On-campus Housing

On-campus housing is <u>not</u> guaranteed. It is on a first-come, first-served basis and preference is given to Academic Year students. Spring semester students also have a higher chance of securing a room.

That being said, our students are usually able to obtain a room; but this also depends on the number of residents in the dorm, so <u>students should be open to off-campus housing, as well</u>, even though it is likely that they will obtain a room on campus.

• If you are interested in staying in our dorms, please wait to hear back from the Summit before looking at different options (off-campus housing).

Academic Year 2025 - 2026 Prices:

• **Shared Double Room:** \$6,675 per semester

• **Single Occupancy Room:** \$8,450 per semester

Dorm prices change every year and are likely to increase in the future.

Students should complete an application to the Summit as soon as their exchange application is submitted.

IMPORTANT NOTES ABOUT THE DORM

- Students who sign a contract with the Summit and then cancel are subject to a cancellation fee (at least \$1,000).

Course Limitations:

- Exchange Students must be Full-Time at Queens College—12 credits/units, no more, no less.
- Exchange Students <u>cannot</u> take W Courses (writing intensive courses), unless they are native English speakers.
 - W courses are very writing intensive. Even English native speakers should not take more than 1 or 2 of these courses.
 - o Sometimes exceptions are made for English majors.

- Graduate Students: Exchange Students <u>cannot</u> take Graduate Courses, even if they are
 pursuing a Master's Degree in their home country. Graduate students must take
 Undergraduate courses.
- Education Students: It is important to note that the Education Department is one of the only departments for which we cannot guarantee classes. It is one of the biggest departments in the school, and priority is given to seniors. Once the students are admitted, we can work with the department and try to get them classes. But it is important that they be flexible with their classes and have back-up classes from different departments, just in case. (There are also Education courses in other departments such as Music, Sociology, Psychology, etc.)
- **Computer Science** classes are not guaranteed.
- The BALA (Business) Department may have restrictions on the number of BALA courses one student can take
- Music Courses: In order to take Music Courses, you must be majoring in Music at your home university. You will have to audition for our Music School. Complete the Music Major Questionnaire with your Application and someone will reach out to you with more information.
