The Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) in Critical Languages Education is a program of initial and professional certification combined into a 39-credit master's program. The MAT program consists of two phases: 24 credits for Initial Certification and 15 credits of curriculum and assessment courses leading to Professional Certification in the language. The Initial Certification segment can be completed in 3 semesters for candidates who begin studying in the spring semester. Candidates may register for the 15 credits in Language Education (SEYS) after completing the 24 credits for initial certification.

As an admissions requirement, candidates must pass the Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) and Writing Proficiency Test (WPT) in the language with a rating of at least Advanced Low.

Requirements for Admission, Matriculation, and Retention for the MAT in Critical Languages

- 1) A minimum overall GPA of 3.0 enter and remain in the program. Additional admission requirements include an admissions essay, three letters of recommendation, and a current TOEFL score if the Bachelor degree was awarded outside the United States.
- 2) Candidates must have completed an undergraduate program in which they majored in the language of certification or have taken a minimum of 21 credits in college-level language courses. They also must have proof of testing and score at least Advanced Low on both the full telephonic Oral Proficiency Interview and Writing Proficiency Test (OPI and WPT) in the Critical Language(s). These scores are used in lieu of the content area language credits as per the NYSED website and ACTFL. http://www.highered.nysed.gov/tcert/actfl.html
- 3) These scores are required for admissions and certification at Queens College. Applicants must register for the full telephone OPI and computer WPT at: www.languagetesting.com.
