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LIBERAL ARTS REQUIREMENTS:

- (A) **30 CREDITS IN ONE OF THE FOLLOWING SOCIAL SCIENCES:**
History, Anthropology, Economics, Sociology, Political Science, Urban Studies, AND
- (B) **One Economics class, AND one Political Science class;**
- (C) **Of the above, at least 21 credits in History/Geography is required, to include at least two (2) courses in US History, two (2) courses in NON-US History. (NOTE: Some of these courses MAY be taken at the graduate level and count towards an MS degree in Secondary Education, Social Studies.)**

A minimum GPA of 3.0 is required to enter and remain in the program. (To enter the program, students must have completed an undergraduate program in which they majored in a Social Studies-related subject and minored in secondary education – or the equivalent.)

Note that students who majored in a Social Studies-related subject (or the equivalent) but did not take any courses in Secondary Education should apply for the Initial Certificate Program which they will be required to take 21 credits of prerequisite study: SEYS 536, 552, 563, 573.2, 573.4, 583, 700.
