Through all of the coursework you have taken (at all universities you have attended), you must have:

- A) completed one economics course (for a letter grade)
- B) completed one political science course (for a letter grade)
- C) completed a social studies major of 30 credits or more (e.g., history, economics, political science, sociology, Africana Studies, and others)#
- D) completed at least 21 credits of history (2 courses are required in US history, and 2 courses are required in non- US History (and one of those must be non-Western, like history of Africa, Asia, or Oceania))*#
- *Note: If you complete(d) a social studies major in history, then you have met both requirements for C and D.

#Note: If you find yourself having to take additional social studies content courses to fulfil requirements C and D, consider that graduate content taken at Queens College during the Graduate Initial Certificate Program *may* also count toward your content requirement for a hypothetical future MSED in social studies. Please consult with an advisor before planning such an endeavor.
