

Art

Art History

Art history is the study of world art from ancient times to the present. Those who major in this field often go on to careers in galleries, auction houses, museums, libraries, and nonprofit organizations, or teach the subject in elementary and high schools and universities. The skills of close looking and visual analysis developed through the study of art history can also be applied in a wide variety of fields beyond the fine arts.

Design

Queens College's Design program combines knowledgeable faculty with industry-standard software and the creativity of a studio-based learning environment. With our three concentrations in communication design, animation & illustration, or interaction design, students can specialize in techniques and approaches that prepare them for a multitude of design-based careers, including graphic designers, software and web developers, illustrators, animators, marketing and advertising specialists, or product designers.

Photography and Imaging

The Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in photography and imaging prepares students in their pursuit of careers or advanced degrees in fine art, applied photography, and digital imaging. The curriculum incorporates the latest 2-D and 3-D technologies for capturing and outputting images. Students choose among a variety of courses in the practice of photography including traditional/analog and alternative processes, digital, 2-D and 3-D scanning and printing, theory, history, and critical thinking. Students will graduate with a portfolio that can be used to seek or further their careers in the field or apply to graduate school.


Graduates of the program could be considered for positions in photo editing and research, photojournalism, studio portrait and product photography, architecture and fine art photography, commercial and industrial photography, scientific photography, travel and lifestyle photography, photo retouching, 3-D imaging, and digital archiving.

Studio Art

Students who pursue a studio art major receive a balance of theory and practice, an understanding of the intellectual and technical skills required in the fine arts, and preparation for a creative professional life as an artist. Students hone their skills to create artwork to be sold to museums, galleries, and individuals.

Drama, Theatre & Dance

The Drama, Theatre & Dance curriculum offers a balanced and rigorous combination of theory and practice that aims to give an understanding of live performance that can serve as a foundation for graduate study and professional work. Each student receives an advisor and hands-on mentorship that helps to develop their individual skills and assist them in planning their post-graduate career path. The small sizes of the program and our classes allow us to give an outstanding overall foundation in the principles of live performance, combined with the intense individual focus usually found in a conservatory program.



The Aaron Copland School of Music

The music curriculum develops the interdependent skills of performing, listening to, and understanding music, and thus provides the thorough training necessary for graduate study and a career in the profession. qc.cuny.edu/music

All music applicants must complete an audition and music placement exams before they are admitted to the music program.

The Standard Music Major

This major is for students preparing for a career as a performer, conductor, composer, arranger, musicologist, or teacher in a conservatory, university, or other institution not requiring state certification.

The Performance Major

This program is for advanced students in instrumental or vocal performance. Admission is by competitive audition in the student's major instrument or voice.

The Music Major with the Music Education Sequence

This major is for students who intend to teach music in public schools or other institutions that require state certification.

The Performance Major and Music Certification

Students who qualify can take Music Education courses and also obtain New York State Music Teacher Certification.

Completion of these two programs normally takes five years.
