The QC School of Arts is proud to present its inaugural Arts Leadership Boot Camp, designed for students to learn what it means to be a professional in the arts from industry experts in various artistic fields.

The Bootcamp will take place **in person** during the weekend of **March 3rd to March 5th** on the **CUNY Queens College campus**. Boot camp activities will include panel discussions, meeting with experts in small groups for 1:1 feedback, workshops in branding and social media, and special events. Discussions will touch upon major relevant issues including diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI), financial literacy, hybrid programming, multi-hyphenate careers, and more.

For now, the Arts Leadership Boot Camp is only open to students from **Queens College**, **Hostos Community College**, **LaGuardia Community College**, **and Queensborough Community College**.

Students must be available for the **entire weekend** (Friday, March 3rd, Saturday, March 4th, and Sunday, March 5th) to be selected as a participant, and the Boot Camp hours range from 10:00 am to 7:00 pm on Friday and Saturday and 10:00 am to 2:00 pm on Sunday, with lunch and breaks included.
