PARTNERSHIP OVERVIEW

In May 2024, the Queens College School of Arts (QC SoA) partnered with NYC Parks to bring vibrant arts and cultural programming to public spaces across Queens.

An initiative designed by QC School of Arts **Associate Dean Julia del Palacio** and implemented by **Program & Communications Manager Neophytos Ioannou**, the fivementh partnership consisted of dance workshops, arts trail nature walks, Jazz and World Music concerts, and more to enhance the lives of New Yorkers, promote well-being, and provide invaluable professional opportunities for SoA students and graduates. This initiative took place at eight Queens Parks in its inaugural year.
