PARTNERSHIP OVERVIEW

Between fall 2024 and summer 2025, the Queens College School of Arts (QC SoA) partnered with NYC Parks to bring vibrant arts and cultural programming to public spaces across Queens.

An initiative designed by QC School of Arts **Associate Dean Julia del Palacio** and implemented by **Program & Communications Manager Neophytos Ioannou**, the partnership consisted of dance workshops, arts trail nature walks, jazz and World Music concerts, and more to enhance the lives of New Yorkers, promote well-being, and provide invaluable professional opportunities for SoA students and graduates.

Now in its **second year**, the initiative spanned **twelve** Queens parks, with the majority of events concentrated in summer 2025 and select dates held in fall, winter, and spring.

KEY PARTNERSHIP OBJECTIVES

- Expand access to arts and culture for diverse communities throughout Queens.
- Foster collaboration among SoA students, alumni, staff, and NYC Parks to deliver free programming.
- Transform public spaces into hubs of creative expression, learning, and connection.
- Strengthen community well-being through accessible cultural experiences to engage and inspire.

Activities ranged from performances, workshops, and interactive trails and included Arts Trail Nature Walks, Visual Art Workshops, Percussion Workshops, World Music Concerts, Jazz Concerts, Theatre Performances, Dance Performances, Salsa Dance Workshops, Hip Hop Dance Workshops, and Afro-Caribbean Dance Workshops.

This year, the School of Arts presented a reimagined, in-the-round theater adaptation of Sergei Prokofiev's *Peter and the Wolf*, touring 17 free performances in Queens parks. More than 500 attendees enjoyed family-friendly productions brought to life by School of Arts students and recent alumni, led by faculty mentorship. The series nurtured emerging talent, activated public spaces, and strengthened community connections across the borough.
