GUIDE FOR REFEREES

Thank you for donating your time and expertise. By the time you receive the manuscript, the editors have read it and felt it to be possibly within the scope of the journal. We would like you to consider the article according to the following key criteria, which we would expect from an article suitable for publication. Feel free to list your comments in bullet-point format and/or paragraph narratives. Please state in your review report if the article fulfills these criteria.

1. The article should make reference to previous research or theories, and these should be well documented. It should provide a clear indication of how the article is related to this body of literature, and how it makes an innovative contribution to the field.

2. If the article is a qualitative or quantitative empirical study, it should have a systematic and coherent method of study. Such articles should include a clear account of the study's theoretical foundation, project background, objectives, participants, procedures, data analysis, and conclusions.

3. If the article refers to a developmental project, or current or innovative practice, it should provide a clear account of its context, theoretical foundation, target group(s), justification and (anticipated) outcomes as well as how it relates to past and/or future pedagogy. Although we encourage submissions based on practice, TILCA is also very interested in papers that report on research on that practice.

4. The article should discuss theoretical and practical implications for pedagogy, future research, or development, as appropriate.

5. The article should be of an acceptable quality in terms of accuracy, clarity and coherence.

Please provide comments and suggestions with view to the above criteria, please specify if comments are intended for authors or, separately, if they are confidential notes to the editors. If intended for the authors, your comments and suggestions should be sufficiently specific to help authors improve and revise the article for publication or re-submission to TILCA or another journal (if rejected).
