# **Religious Celebrations**

At Queens College, we're proud to support our students by providing spaces and programs that foster faith, community, and belonging. We offer a dedicated prayer space in the Student Union that is open every day, giving students a quiet and comfortable place for daily prayers and reflection. The Queens College Association provides an Imam who offers spiritual guidance, supports religious life, and works closely with students to nurture an inclusive campus environment.

During Ramadan, the college provides Iftar meals to ensure that students observing the fast can come together to break bread and celebrate in community. Additionally, The City University of New York is one of the first universities in the country to officially recognize Eid-al-Fitr and Eid al-Adha as holidays, meaning no classes are held on these days.
