Revised Procedures Regarding Differentials for Lecturers Who Hold Doctoral

Degrees

Since January 1, 1990, Article 24 of the PSC/CUNY collective bargaining agreement has contained a provision relating to a salary differential to be paid to Lecturers who hold doctoral degrees. The current agreement states, in relevant part:

Lecturers who hold doctoral degrees from an accredited university in a field related to the discipline taught or the job duties performed by the Lecturer shall receive a differential. This differential is included in the salaries listed under the title "Lecturer Doctoral Schedule." (2002-2007 PSC/CUNY collective bargaining agreement, Article 24.2 (a), page 46)

Currently, colleges are required to submit a form (copy attached) to the Office of Faculty and Staff Relations when they are recommending a Lecturer to the Board of Trustees for appointment on the Doctoral Schedule. **Effective immediately, the colleges are no longer required to submit the form to the Office of Faculty and Staff Relations.** Rather, the colleges should continue to complete the form and retain it in the Office of Human Resources for audit purposes.
